\$62,578 (\$84,726) and Expenses \$46,218 (from \$84,341).

2020-2021 PRESIDENTS REPORT

2020-21was going to be the year of post Covid – but alas it was another year of Covid-19 challenges for our businesses and community.

2020-21was the year of: QR Codes - Service Victoria App — Victorian Statewide Restrictions — Chief Health Officer Directions — Density Quotient Limits — $4m^2$ pp — $2m^2$ pp — Mask / Mask Off — Essential/non-essential Retail -Interpretion of continually changing rules — extreme challenges in planning events — Disruption and confusion — (just to name a few)

Our small organisation has pivoted like many of our businesses and improved our digital communications with members and the business community. We managed to duck and weave the many changes to restrictions without resorting to Zoom or Teams . The Executive timed when we could meet and rather than attempting regular member meetings put on a number of business networking events when permitted. It was definitely another year of challenges – which in turn proved to be opportunities.

Rather than throw our hands in the air because everything was hard we did what we always do — we focused on what we could do within the rules of the day and tap into funding avenues that became available to us to be the most effective organisation in the Alpine Shire that people can approach in order to facilitate the establishment and development of any idea, events and infrastructure which assists the economic, employment and business growth in Myrtleford and the Alpine Shire community.

2020-21 was an exceptionally busy year with many achievements – Partnerships and sourced funding have enabled our small organisation to:

- Complete Myrtleford Splash Park concept design and handed to Council ready to tender
- Relocate and operated Myrtleford's Annual Bush Market from the Myrtleford Recreation Reserve
- Introduced the Myrtleford Summer Series 13 live outdoor performances supporting local entertainers and encouraging everyone to buy take out and BYO their dinner to the Piazza
- Conducted LaFiera Italian Festival amidst stringent covid restrictions
- Completed first stage renovations to the Church Hall adjacent Piazza including kitchen and installation of heating and cooling
- Attracted new outdoor community infrastructure including 150 stackable chairs, 10 tables and 10 umbrellas
- Installed a life size 'Snakes and Ladders" mosaic game in Jubilee Park
- Designed and locally fabricated a modern Christmas Tree for the town
- Ran business networking Events such as 'Under the Umbrellas' outdoors in the Piazza and business networking at Club Savoy with Tom O'Toole (Beechworth Bakery) and Billy Button Cellar Door. Giving our members the opportunity to have a night off from cooking and enjoy company form other business operators

Together with the assistance of 10 member businesses and the Alpine Shire, developed a
Myrtleford promotion which aired on Prime TV during December 2020 and January 2021
and the Win Network in April 2021. Capturing the essence of Myrtlefords business
community and the absolutely beautiful landscape that produces some of the best
produce and wine in Australia.

- Put together a "Welcome to Myrtleford Pack" for visitors holidaying in Myrtleford post Covid-19 restrictions. Each pack was valued at over \$125 and was distributed to our Financial Member accommodation providers early October.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT

To the Committee of Myrtleford Chamber of Commerce & Industry Inc.,

Based on our review, which is not an audit, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the 30th June 2021 financial reports of Myrtleford Chamber of Commerce & Industry Incorporated does not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Myrtleford Chamber of Commerce & Industry Incorporated as at 30th June 2021, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for 30th June 2021 ended on that date, in accordance with applicable financial reporting framework.
